NETWORK SOLUTIONS FOR VULNERABLE GROUPS

Programme

MEETING CONCEPT

The meeting is intended to provide a forum for the exchange of knowledge, experiences, and practices related to supporting vulnerable communities through cooperation between universities, local governments, civil society organisations, and other stakeholders.

The discussion will focus on network solutions, understood as forms of collaboration that facilitate communication, knowledge exchange, coordination, and joint action among different actors. Particular attention will be given to cooperation between cities and universities, while recognising the contribution of NGOs, municipal companies, and local communities.

For the purpose of the meeting, vulnerable communities are understood as groups that may be disproportionately affected by demographic, economic, social, or environmental changes in urban areas. These include, among others, older adults, young people, families facing difficult life circumstances, and other groups at risk of social exclusion.

Drawing on the experience of Zielona Góra, the meeting will examine how cooperation between cities, universities, and their partners can contribute to:

- ✓ strengthening local capacities to address the needs of vulnerable communities;
- ✓ designing and implementing network-based approaches to selected urban challenges;
- ✓ integrating research, policy, and practice in the development of local solutions;
- ✓ developing cross-sector cooperation between local governments, universities, NGOs, municipal companies, and community organisations.

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Participants are encouraged to actively contribute to the discussion and share their knowledge and experience related to the topics addressed during the meeting. A particular opportunity for exchange will be provided by the **marketplace in the form of a poster session**, scheduled for Friday, 23 October 2026. The session will offer a space for presenting ideas and planned projects, as well as for sharing outcomes and experiences from completed initiatives. Participants may also use the poster session to disseminate concepts, explore potential cooperation opportunities, and identify possible partners for future activities. Participation in the poster session can be indicated during the registration process for the Zielona Góra meeting, which will open in early September 2026.

The meeting is intended to facilitate discussion on existing practices, identify areas for further cooperation, and support the exchange of experiences that may be relevant to other cities and institutions.

- Academics and researchers working on vulnerable communities and social inclusion, particularly those engaged in practical solutions and collaboration with practitioners in the field.
- Policymakers and political representatives working on vulnerable communities and social inclusion, particularly those involved in developing policies and practical solutions in collaboration with local stakeholders.
- Students and early-career researchers interested in vulnerable communities and social inclusion, particularly those engaged in research, innovation and practical projects addressing social challenges.
- Municipalities and public service providers working with vulnerable communities, particularly those involved in developing and implementing practical solutions to improve access to essential services.
- NGOs and community organisations working with vulnerable communities and social inclusion, particularly those engaged in grassroots solutions and collaboration with public authorities, researchers and other practitioners.
